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# The Challenge: Transportation for non-Medicaid eligible dialysis patients

DeKalb County has 713,000 residents

**\***10% 65+

❖10.6% Have a disability

❖19.5% Live in poverty

♦ 53.2% African-American

1,430 Dialysis patients

(32% eligible for Medicaid NEMT)





## A Viable Solution: Volunteer Driving

- Transportation provided directly to consumers via volunteer drivers
- Transportation provided free of charge
- Revenue captured through donations and grants
- Consumers attracted through direct outreach to DeKalb County dialysis centers & Senior Services

#### I Care, Inc. Track Record

- 15 years experience in volunteer driving
- 60 drivers provided 1,500 rides in 2014
- Diverse funding stream
- Very high customer satisfaction
- Experience transporting chemotherapy patients





#### Why Should We Care?

- ❖ By 2030, one in five Americans will be over the age of 65.
- ❖ 25% increase in DeKalb's population from 2000-2030
- Over 50% of DeKalb residents live in areas without transit
- 90% of I Care clients use the service as their primary means of transportation
- Many clients report that if it were not for I CARE, they would forego their medical care due to a lack of transportation
- I CARE can anticipate significant increases in dialysis clients through 2030





#### Invest in a Proven Model

- Strong revenue model
- Annual budget of \$65,289.92
- \$9500 will allow I CARE to provide 288 trips
- Continuing aggressive funding campaign will sustain project in the long run
